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Germany is lagging behind the rest of Europe when it comes to rail network electrification. This is according to non-profit transport alliance Allianz pro Schiene, which has noted that at 61% electrification, Germany is significantly behind other European countries such as Switzerland, Belgium, the Netherlands and Sweden, which have achieved between 70–100%.

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
