Gender differences in caregiver-burden. Caregiver-burden has been defined as "a multidimensional response to physical, psychological, emotional, social, and financial stressors associated with the caregiving experience"[5,64,65]. Alzheimer disease (AD), a progressive neurodegenerative disorder that affects cognition and behavior, has a clinical duration of approximately 8-10 years. It affects families, not just the individual. By 2050, more than 100 million individuals will be affected by AD worldwide. Memory impairment is the most common presenting symptom; however, others may present atypically.
