10 Guiding Principles for Patient-Centered Care

Specifically, ACP defined patient- and family-centered care as “an approach to the planning, delivery, and evaluation of health care that is grounded in mutually beneficial partnerships among health care providers, patients, and families.” Those tenets provided, ACP developed four core principles to patient- and family-centered care, including:

Principles of person centred care: Picker

Patient-centered care involves transforming the relationship between providers and patients from the traditional model, in which a care provider prescribes the same treatment for most patients with similar diagnoses or conditions, into a patient-provider partnership that considers treatment options based on a patient's unique concerns, preferences, and values.

Appendix D: Eight Dimensions of Patient-Centered Care

The patient centered medical home (PCMH) model has become a cornerstone of primary care redesign. While the concept of the medical home was first introduced for pediatric settings by the American Academy of Pediatrics in 1967, the major primary care physician associations developed and endorsed the joint principles of the PCMH in 2007.

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
